## INTERPRETIVE CONSIDERATIONS

The scores in this report are based on normative data obtained from 9- to 12-year-olds who were being seen in professional treatment settings for family, academic, social, and/or emotional problems. Scores reported for respondents who inappropriately took the M-PACI inventory for other than such clinical purposes may be inaccurate. Further, owing to developmental fluctuations in emotion and behavior that are characteristic of this age group, this score report should be considered a "snapshot" of this child's emerging and changeable psychological patterns.

This report must be employed as only one aspect of a thorough clinical evaluation. It should not be shown directly to either the child or her family without prudent consideration and clinical discretion.

The child who completed this M-PACI inventory is a 10-year-old girl. She is in the 5th grade at school.
